Eid al - Fitr is the first of the celebrations, which will be marked from 12th to the 13th May this year, followed by Eid al - Adha on 19th July.

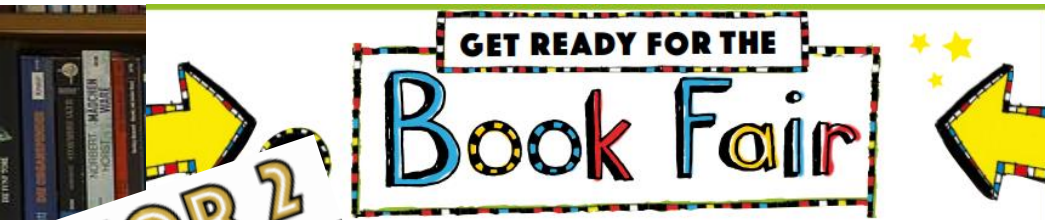

mental health!

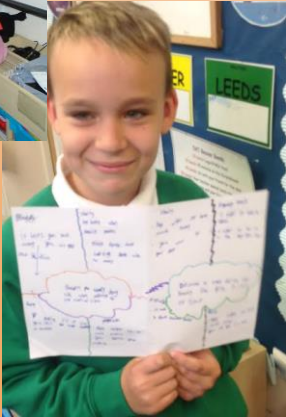
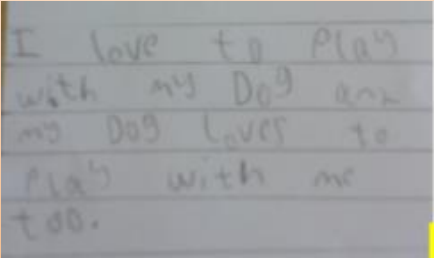
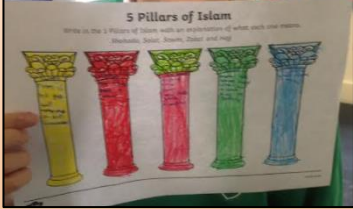

We have enjoyed learning about Animals this term in the Nursery.

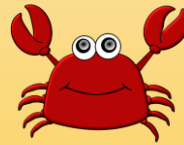
We have learnt about farm animals!

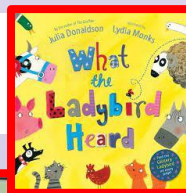
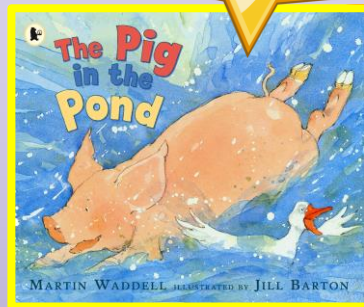

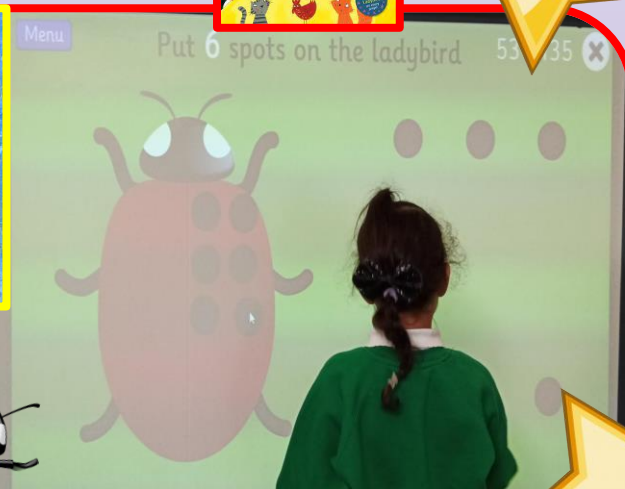


# Star of the week - Reception

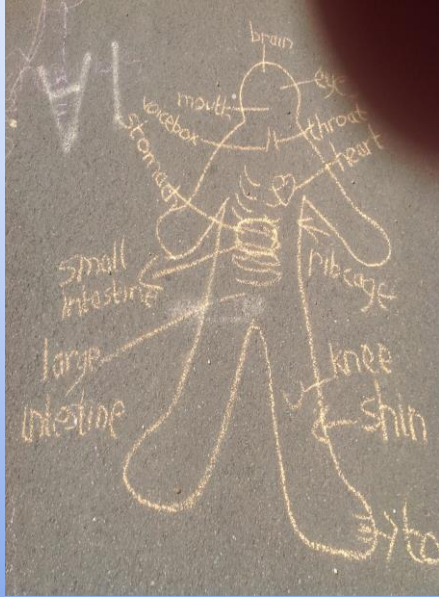

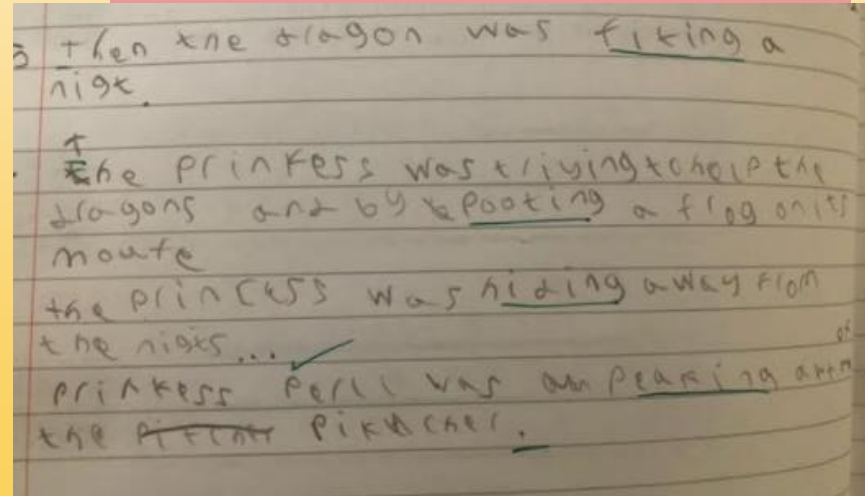
# Star of the week - Year 2

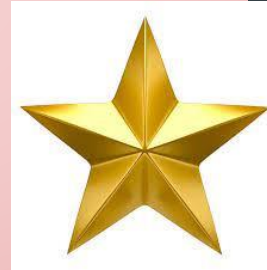


# Star of the week - Year 3

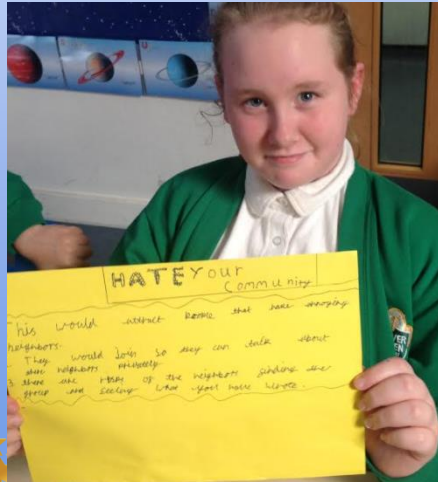
