Did you know:

- Around 97% of all water is in the **oceans** and they cover around 71% of Earth's surface.
- The Pacific **Ocean** is the biggest one.
- You can find mountains and volcanoes on the bottom of the **oceans**.
- The deepest point in the **ocean** is the Mariana Trench.
- Oceanic evaporation is the source of most rainfall.

## Chromebook Returns

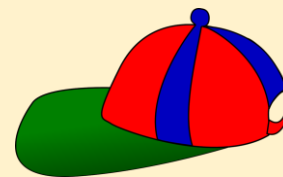


If you borrowed a Chromebook during lockdown please can you return it to school by Monday June 21st, ensuring all cases and chargers are returned too. Thank you.

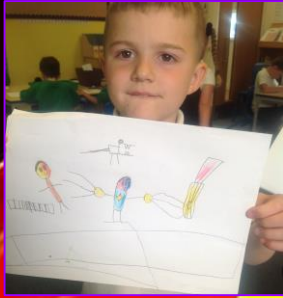

We also enjoyed singing and dancing to our favourite music and learning about the instruments in an orchestra!



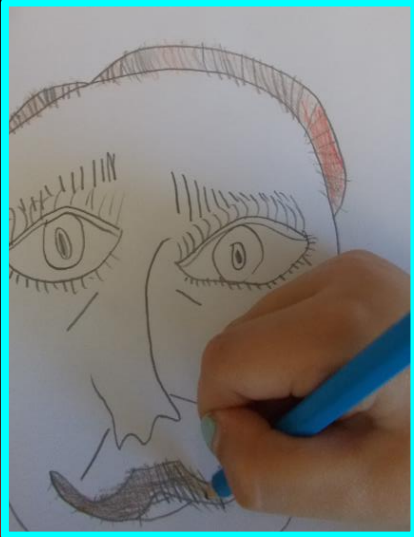
We had great fun imagining ourselves as famous musicians and designing our own outfits!

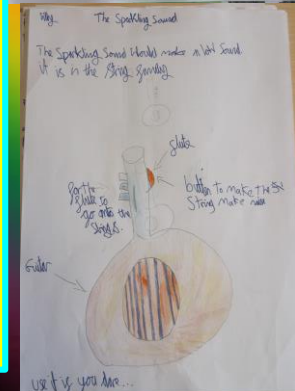


# Beaver Green Music Day

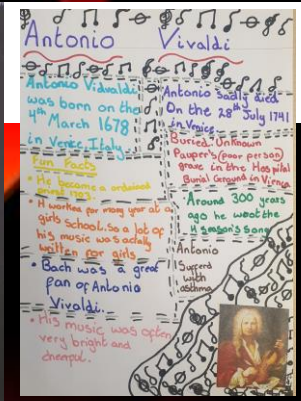
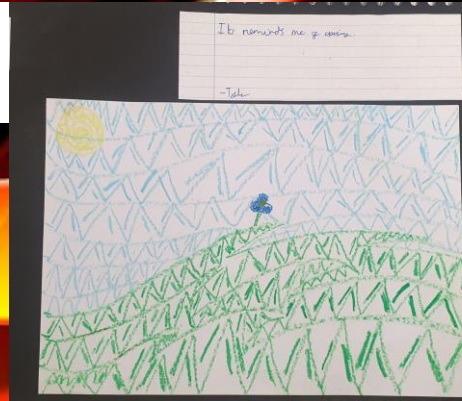
# Beaver Green Music Day

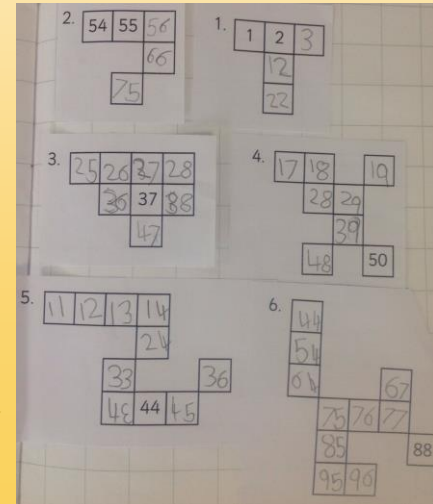

# Year 4 Learning in Term 6



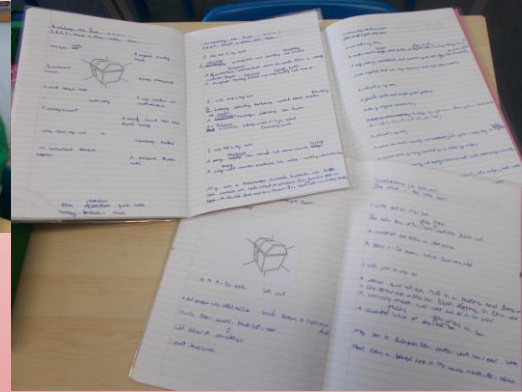
In Science, 4KB had lots of fun deciding if things were solids, liquids or gases and trying to work out whether jelly was a solid or liquid!



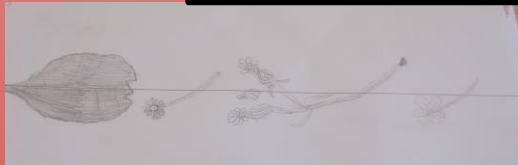
With Mrs Lockwood, 4KB took part in 30 Days Wild and did some observational drawings of wild plants.
