## Star of the Week - Nursery


The Dragonfly Room star of the week is Sara

# Star of the Week - Reception






This week in Smith class, Jude is star of the week for trying really hard with his writing and wanting to make improvements.






This week in Lloyd class, Brian is star of the week. He worked really hard to write his name. Well done Brian.


The Star of The Week in Wilson Class this week is Tommy for all his hard work during Maths! Well done.
