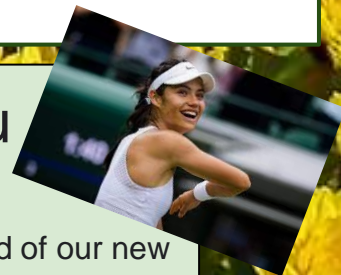

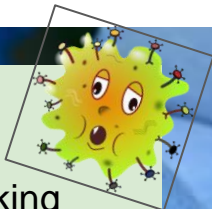

School Updates

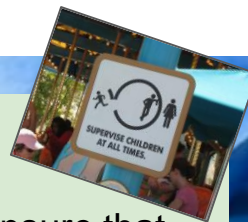
Flu vaccination

Barnett Classes star of the week is Toby! Toby has put so much effort into his learning so far this term and we are really proud of him. Well done Toby!



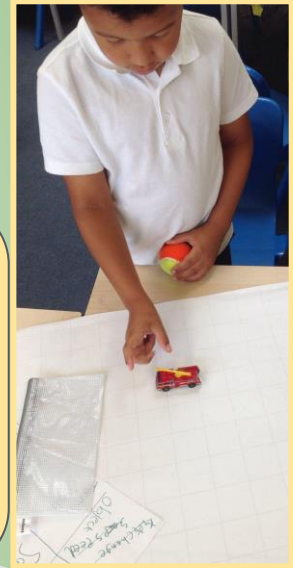
The star of the week for Wiesner class goes to Sienna for working extremely hard in Maths. Well done Sienna!

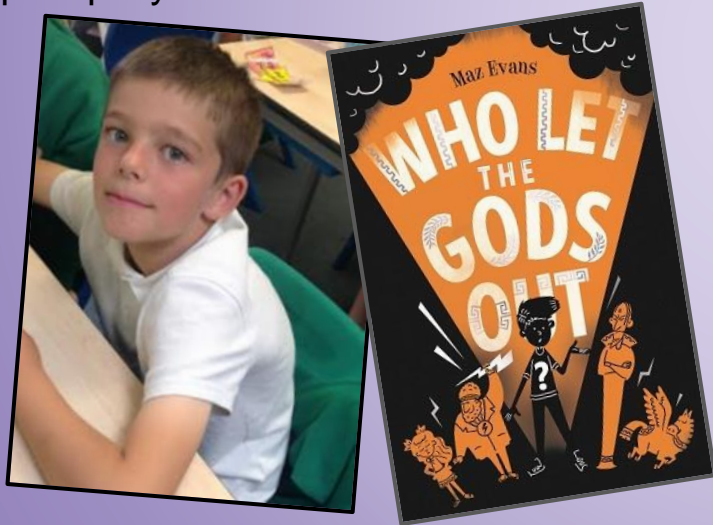

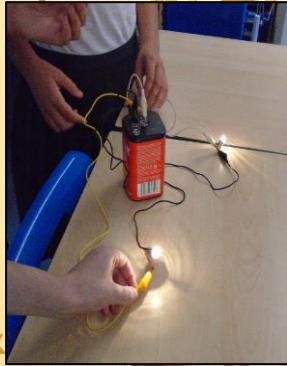
