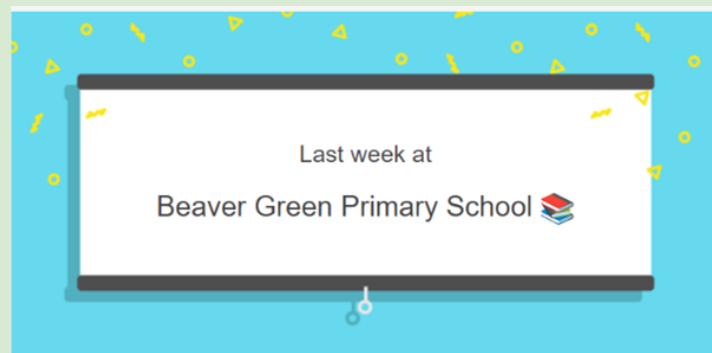

## Active WOW

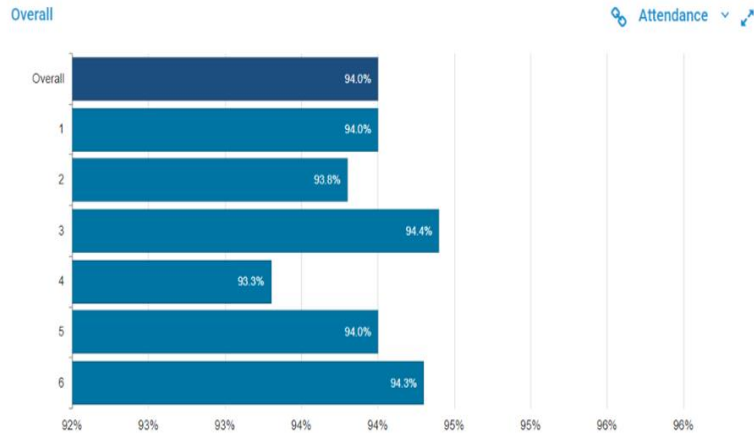

## Attendance - year to date.

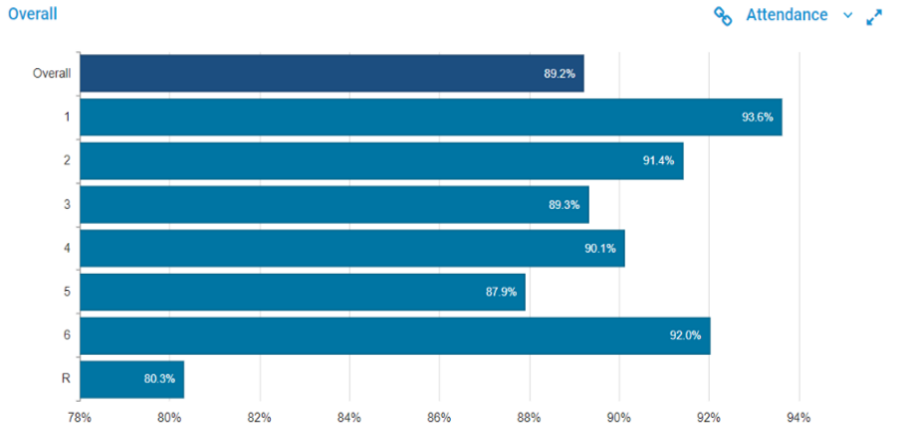
Our overall attendance for the year to date is 94%

The winning year group this week is Year 1 with attendance of 93.6%. The individual class with the best attendance is Sam Lloyd class with 93.9%. Well done!





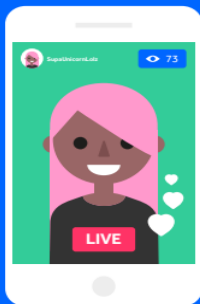
# Safety Tip of The Week

## Live streaming & vlogging

### BASIC TIPS

#### Before 'going live' or recording:

- Check privacy settings to see who the video will be shared with - ensure the only friends and followers option is selected
- Follow or friend your child's account so you'll be able to see their live streams and videos
- Read up on the app or platform to learn how to use the app safely



- Switch off GEO location on the app, device or platform so they don't reveal where they are
- Encourage them to think critically about what they say as the video will be online even after the live broadcast is finished
- Discuss what they'd like to share - create a storyboard together to help organise their ideas



#### While recording or live streaming:

- Ensure what they share complies with the platform's community rules and they know not to stream or share third party content like films or concerts
- If there are any people commenting or saying inappropriate things make sure they know how to block and report this as soon as it happens
- Encourage them to record in a public place and share a limited amount of personal content

#### Storing and sharing video

- Decide where and how the video will be shared after the live stream is over. Make them aware of how to delete it on the platform if they need to

## How popular is live streaming and vlogging among young people?

According to our research, there is a larger number of young people watching vlogs and live streams than 'going live' or creating their own content. We've found while 22% of 4 – 16-year-olds are live streaming, 41% of them are watching the content rather than creating it.

## What do parents think about live streaming and vlogging?

- Seven out of 10 parents say it's difficult to know whether certain vlogs or vloggers are suitable for their kids.
- Many parents are concerned about the suitability of the content for children and the responses from other people are the main concerns
- Most parents of those who don't already create live streams would not permit their child to do so
- Very few parents would permit their children who don't already vlog to start doing so
- On a positive note, 44% of parents believe their children have learnt good things from vloggers – 33% think they're a good role model. But 65% feel the lifestyles portrayed in vlogs give young people unrealistic expectations about life.

# Year R's Exciting News!



We are really excited to say that we have some baby stick insects. We have had some stick insect eggs for 2 months and two of these have hatched this week. 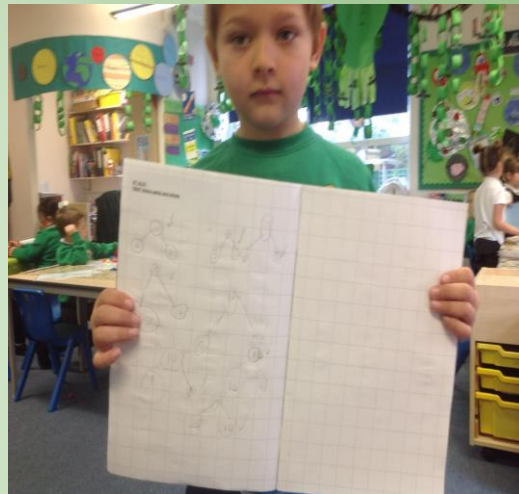
In Ladybird Class our star of the week is Kara. Kara held one of our baby stick insects and was really brave when doing so. She said it was moving really quick! Well done Kara!

# Star of the Week - Year 3

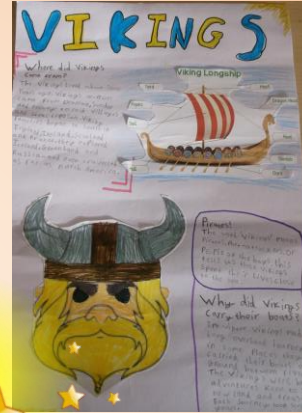
Our Star of the Week in Wilson class is Jake for working so hard and taking pride in his work. Congratulations!

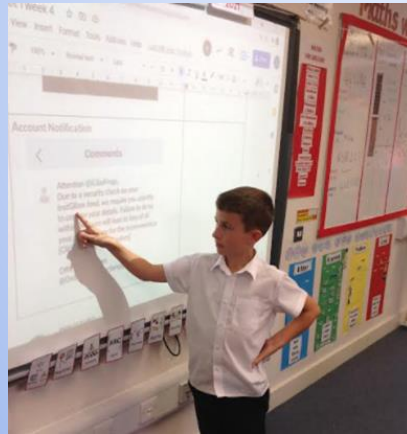
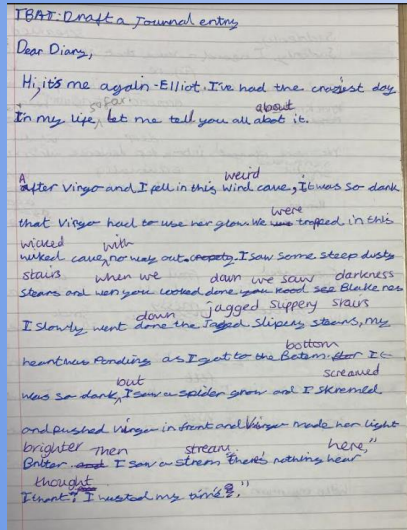

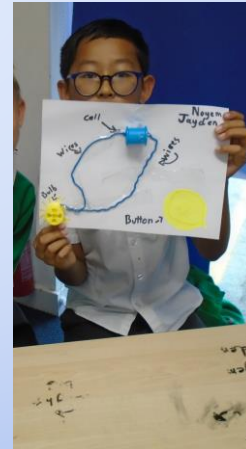


# Star of the Week - Year 5
