Attendance - Remember we aim for 96% for all children.


Attendance - year to date up to 21/10/21

We discussed what it means to be a good friend, made a colourful ark and conducted a floating and sinking experiment.
























The mezuzah

Finley - the man has a blindfold and he is trusting the man with his hand out to catch him.











We took part in a debate. We had to decide if we believed in a god and then we had to join a side and form an argument to try and make people swap sides.













Star of the week for Wiesner class is Charlie for his brilliant addition during Maths lessons. Well done Charlie, we are very proud of you!




Star of the week for Barnett Class is Lillie-Grace. She work so hard making her boat in science this week and was so proud of it. Well done Lillie!
