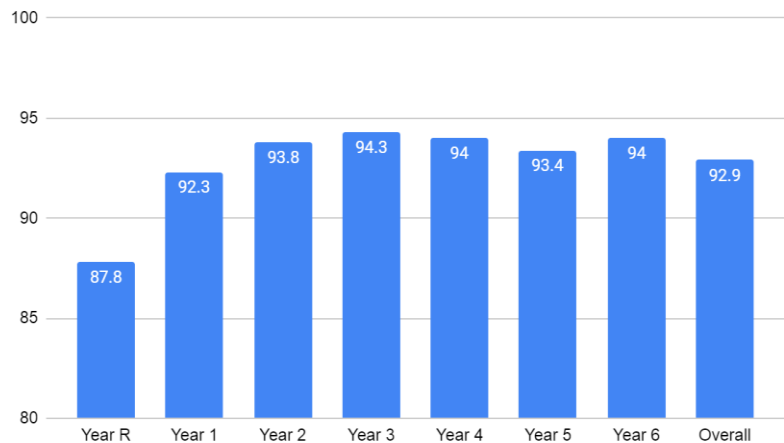
# Attendance - Remember we aim for 96% for all children.

Our overall attendance for the year to date is 92.9%.

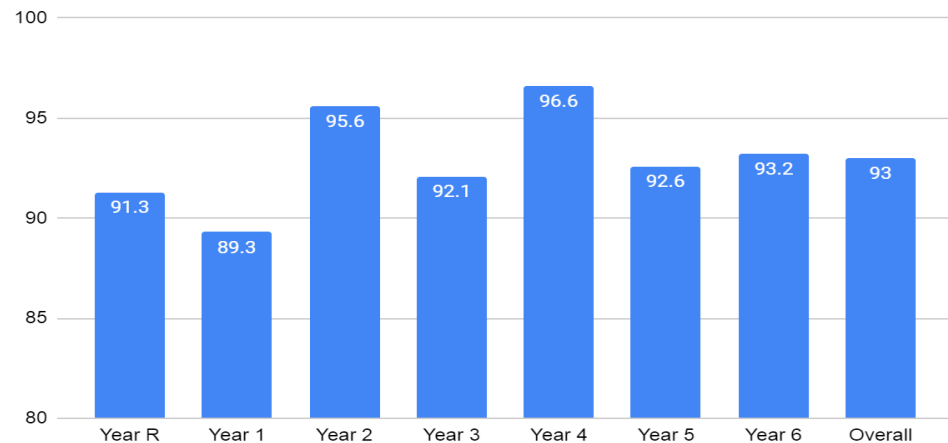

## Weekly attendance (14/10/2021 to 21/10/2021)

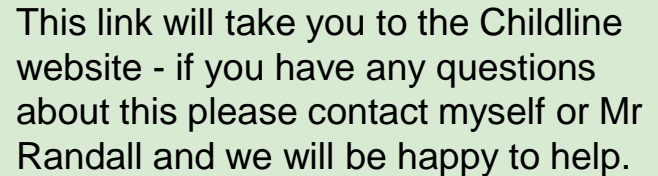

In Year 2 we learnt all about the Mezuzah and how it reminds Jewish people about God. We made our own Mezuzah scrolls and we wrote kind words on them.



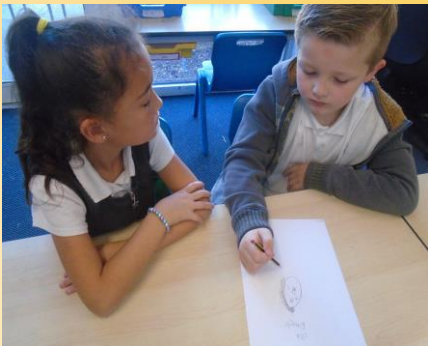
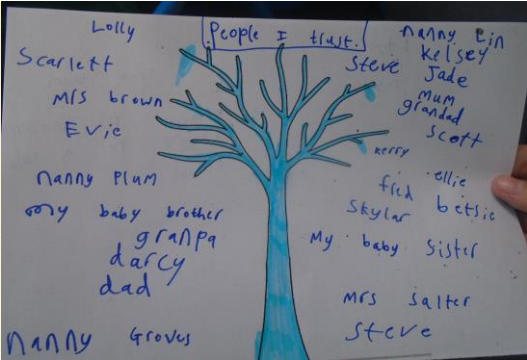


# Beaver Green RE Day - Year 3

We drew portraits of each other. We had to trust in each other!



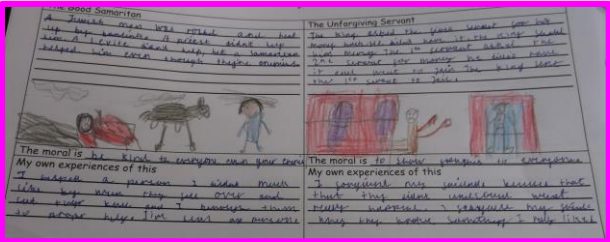
Finley - the man has a blindfold and he is trusting the man with his hand out to catch him.

# Beaver Green RE Day - Year 5



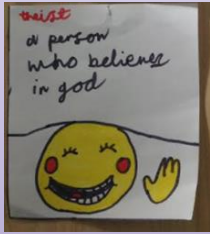
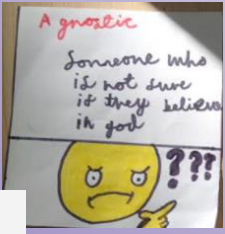
In year 5, we discussed and thought about the question 'Why do people believe in God?' We had a great day of learning about others and learning important, new vocabulary.

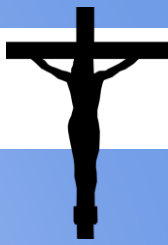


We took part in a debate. We had to decide if we believed in a god and then we had to join a side and form an argument to try and make people swap sides.





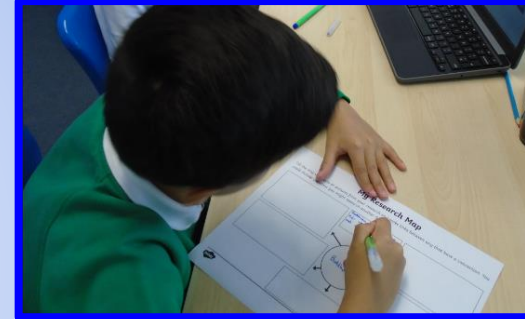
