

"Mae liked dancing, then she became a doctor and after that an astronaut." This week we have been learning about Mae Jemison. The first black woman to go to space.



























In Year 2 this week we have been learning all about Marcus Rashford and how during lockdown he campaigned for children on free school meals.

We explored the ingredients she used in her herbal remedies.




This week we have been learning about Rosa Parks. Who is that? Well, she was an amazing woman who, by refusing to give up her seat on a bus to a white person, helped to start the American Civil Rights movement.

In our writing this week, we have explored the life of Rosa Parks and written short biographies.



We acted out the event which made Rosa Parks famous, thinking carefully about what would have been said and how everyone would have been feeling.



We created timelines of segregation and Rosa's life.



We drew pictures of Rosa Parks splitting the sheet into eight sections so we could draw the features more accurately.

This week we have learned about protests and why people might decide to join or organise a protest. We then looked at some influential people - Martin Luther King Jr being one of them!


Star of the Week - Reception

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The Star of the Week in Bright Class is Lily for her fantastic contributions this week when we were learning about Mary Seacole!


