Safety Tip of The Week

TOY SAFETY TIPS

- + Read age and safety labels
- + Inspect all toys regularly
- + Watch for toys that can become hazards
- + Ensure toys are used in a safe environment
- + Store toys safely
- + Supervise children when they play
- + Keep toys intended for older children away from younger children

Make sure you buy children's gifts for the correct age group and from sources that comply with standards (e.g. does it have the kite mark?).



Look out for small items that could pose a choking hazard to young children, including parts that have fallen off toys, won in crackers, button batteries and burst balloons.



Keep decorations and cards away from fires and other heat sources such as light fittings. Don't leave burning candles unattended, make sure you put them out before going to bed and do not put candles on Christmas trees.



If you have old Christmas lights, seriously consider buying new ones! They will meet much higher safety standards and don't forget to keep the lights switched off until the Christmas tree is decorated, don't let children play with lights (some have swallowed the bulbs) and remember to switch off the lights when going out of the house or to bed.



Give yourself enough time to prepare and cook Christmas dinner to avoid hot fat, boiling water and sharp knife accidents that come from rushing. Keep anyone not helping with dinner out of the kitchen and wipe up any spills quickly.



Have scissors handy to open packaging so you're not tempted to use a knife and have screwdrivers at the ready to assemble toys.



Beware of trailing cables and wires in the rush to connect new gadgets and appliances and always read instructions.






Year 1 Learning in Term 2

In English we looked at instructions to build a snowman.






Christmas craft
