I would like to wish all of our community a very Happy New Year and hope that 2022 is a kind year to you all.


The children have settled well back into school and have worked very hard this week, focussing well on their learning.




Reception Learning in Term 3


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
## Star of the Week - Reception









Teddy is star of the week in Sam Lloyd this week. He has written super sentences about forests. Well done Teddy amazing writing!
