Dear Parents and Carers,

We would like to encourage you to spend **5–10 minutes each day reading with your child** at home. This short, regular time can make a huge difference to your child’s learning and confidence.

Reading is essential because it helps children:

- Develop strong language and vocabulary
- Improve understanding and comprehension
- Build imagination and creativity
- Support learning across all subjects, including writing and maths
- Grow confidence and enjoyment in learning

Even a few minutes a day, done consistently, helps children develop a lifelong love of reading.

How you can support reading at home

When reading together, you can check your child’s understanding by asking simple questions such as:

1. What has happened so far in the story?
2. Who is your favourite character and why?
3. What do you think might happen next?
4. Are there any words you’re not sure what they mean?
5. How do you think the character is feeling?

Recording reading on BoomReader

Please record your child’s reading on **BoomReader** to help us track progress and celebrate success. We understand that it can take time to get used to a new system, so please do not worry.

If you are having difficulty accessing BoomReader, please speak to Mrs Huang or Mrs Jackson, and we will be happy to help you.

To motivate and celebrate reading:

- Children will earn a certificate for every 25 reads, which will be presented in assembly.
- Children will also receive dojos and class raffle tickets for every day they read.
