The Kent Test

Registration for the Kent Test for children due to start secondary school in September 2027 opened on Monday 1st June 2026 and will close at midnight on Wednesday 1st July 2026. They cannot accept late registrations.

The tests are due to take place on Thursday 10th September 2026 for pupils in Kent primary schools and on the weekend of Saturday 12th and 13th September 2026 for other pupils.

The assessment results will be sent on Thursday 15th October 2026 after 4pm.

Application for Secondary School.

Applications for the secondary school intake of September 2027 will open (in early September - Last year it was 1st September until 2nd November 2026 but no dates have been issued yet for this year!) - please look on the KCC Website

The Kent Test



The test assesses whether Grammar School is a suitable option for your child.

- Approximately 25% of the Year 6 children in Kent will be selected for Grammar School.
- Approximately 23% of them are selected using the test.
- Approximately 2% are selected from appeals.

The Tests.



The tests are multiple-choice with a separate answer sheet. They are marked by a computer.

The first test will be an English and maths paper and will take 1 hour. Each section will involve a 5 minute practice exercise followed by a 25 minute test. The English section will involve a comprehension exercise as well as some additional questions drawn from a set designed to test literacy skills.

The second test will be a reasoning paper (verbal and non-verbal). It will take about 1 hour, including the practice sections and questions. It will contain a verbal reasoning section and a non-verbal reasoning section of roughly the same length. The non-verbal reasoning will be split into short sections, administered and timed individually.

There will also be a writing exercise which will not be marked but may be used in an appeals panel as part of the headteacher assessment stage of the process. 40 minutes will be allowed for the writing task, including 10 minutes planning time.

Special Consideration

We can request special arrangements in the tests for children whose access to testing is compromised by disability or SEN. The deadline that we need to know by is 22nd June

- Special Arrangements are to give children access to testing, not to maximise their test scores.
- Each request is given individual professional consideration – there is no blanket concession.
- The school is notified of the decision once it has been processed, and asked to let parents know.
- The Special Arrangements Panel's decision is not subject to appeal - EVIDENCE

Scoring:



3 Separate scores are given - Maths, English, Reasoning. They are all multiple choice and marked by machine with a high degree of accuracy.

- These are age standardised.
- They are also combined for an aggregate.
- **Grammar school threshold 2025.** To be given a grammar school assessment, children needed a total score of 332 or more, with no single score lower than 108 - Test scores range from 69 to 141 for each paper. The highest possible total score is 423.

M - 110 E - 112 R - 118 AG - 340 = G

M - 107 E - 116 R - 110 AG - 333 = H

M - 106 E - 109 R - 110 AG - 325 = H



How the Decision is made.

Schools receive test scores in late September.

Headteacher appeal if necessary:

- Test Scores.
- School work / reports.
- Writing task.
- Headteacher comments.



Results to Families

Parents will be informed (email 4pm / sent a letter) of the decision on 15th October after 4 P.M. They can only send the results to the email address used to register your child.

- The email / letter will indicate suitable for Grammar School (G) or High School (H).
- The scores WILL NOT be given or indications of appeals.
- This information (scores) can be obtained from the school.
- If you wish to make an appeal, you must wait until a school place has been allocated in March.



Parental Appeals for Grammar

School places are allocated in March. If a child did not achieve the threshold scores on the test, they will be allocated a high school (H) place.

- Parents can then lodge an appeal against the allocation of the school place - based on the fact that a Grammar School place is the most suitable for the child.
- School can provide supporting letters and evidence upon request.
- Appeal panels are held in late May / June.



Should my child take the test?

If in doubt, register for your child to take the test - you can withdraw on the day.

Your child's Year 5 teacher will / can advise you as to which type of education your child might be best suited to.

Understand expectations of the Grammar School.

What is the School Doing to Prepare Children for the Test?

Kent schools are not instructed to prepare or coach children for the test.



We do:

English and Maths lessons covering the National curriculum - including differentiated learning opportunities and challenge tasks.

We do not teach the Kent Test.



What can you do?

- Encourage children to do their best and take on a challenge every day.

Evidence in their books can be very important.

Effort, quality of work and learning, presentation - all very important (especially for appeals)
