the **steady heartbeat** of the music

a style of music with a **strong beat on each beat** which the Beatles were famous for playing

the combination of **pitch** and **rhythm** to create a **tune**

music played that **supports the main melody**

part of a song which has **different words** but the **same tune** each time it appears

part of a song which is usually **repeated after each verse**

a percussion instrument that does **not play pitch**

a percussion instrument that **plays pitch**

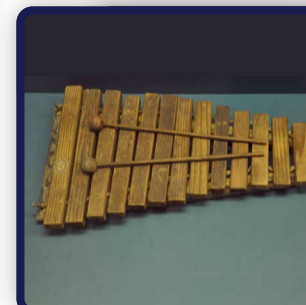
grouping the beat of the music, for example into **groups of 2s, 3s or 4s**

the **speed** of a piece of music



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Liverpool (in red) is where the Beatles were from in England

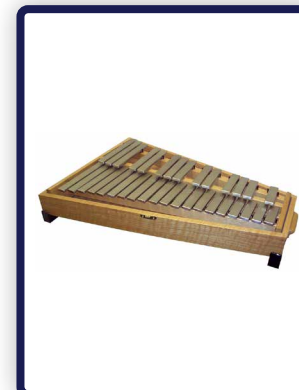


A xylophone – a tuned percussion instrument with wooden bars ('xylo' means wood in Greek)
