Ascension

a special time of **40 days** when Christians get ready for Easter by thinking about God, praying, and sometimes **giving things up** to practise self-control

a **joyful** Christian celebration that remembers when **Jesus came back to life after dying** on the cross

the Christian belief that Jesus **rose from the dead** and was alive again after three days

in Christianity, temptation means **wanting to do something that goes against what God teaches** – even if it seems fun, easy, or popular

the **first day of Lent**, when some Christians go to church and have a cross of ash put on their forehead to show they want to say sorry and make good choices

a **close follower of Jesus** who learned from him and helped share his message

a **name** Christians use for Jesus because they believe he came to **save people** and bring them closer to God

the way Jesus **died on a cross**, which Christians believe was part of God's plan to show love and forgiveness

the moment when Christians believe Jesus went up to **heaven**, 40 days after coming back to life



Palm Sunday

the first Sunday of Holy Week that marks Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem



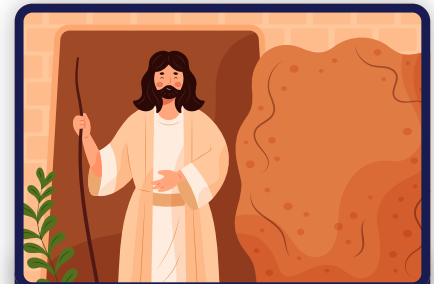
The Last Supper

Jesus and his disciples had a Passover meal, and Jesus revealed he would be betrayed



Good Friday
(crucifixion)

the day when many Christians remember Jesus' death on the cross



Easter Sunday
(resurrection)

a day of joy when many Christians remember Jesus rose from the dead
