
Dear parents and carers,

School Updates

COVID-19 Vaccinations for 5-11 year olds

Please see below information received from the NHS Kent Community Health Team which our school have been asked to share with all parents and carers:

The NHS in Kent and Medway is now offering the Covid-19 vaccine to eligible children aged five to 11-years-old who:

- are at higher risk from coronavirus due to underlying health conditions or
- share living accommodation, on most days, with someone who has a weakened immune system

If you have an eligible child, you will be invited to bring them to have the vaccine by their GP practice, a local vaccination service linked to their GP practice, or the NHS School-Aged Immunisation Service (SAIS).

Parents can either book an appointment directly with their GP, or use this link to book in with any provider: <u>https://lvs.healthit.org.uk/patheks</u>. Eligibility will be checked at the venue.

Star of the Week - Nursery




Star of the week this week is Legend. Legend always listens carefully and is a super helper at tidy up time. Well done Legend!








Learning in Term 4 - Nursery
