






In Year 3 we designed our own churches. We thought about the outside as well and designed our own symbols too.



TBAT: understand and explain how life is a journey and identify how different religions celebrate significant milestones.












Year 4 looked at baptism, marriage and life after death, as well as milestones we want to reach in life.

Treat others how you want to be treated fairly.


Adults go to work but come home early anybody of any colour should be treated fairly.

We created our own kindness trees, where the fruits symbolised good deeds.



We have been focusing on maths and developing our understanding of number. We have looked at colour, number and sorting by colour and size.







We started off our term with an Easter Bonnet parade.




Term 5 - Bumblebee Class
