


What we have been doing in year 20E





This week we have been learning all about colours. We created a beautiful display of rainbows, sunshines and clouds which we are very proud of.




What we have been doing in year 6SH...










What we have been doing in year 6VH



The home learning heroes for 2OE this week are Andrei and Tommy who worked together on these super questions to ask the pirates from 'Pirates love underpants'. Well done!


