### **Online safety**

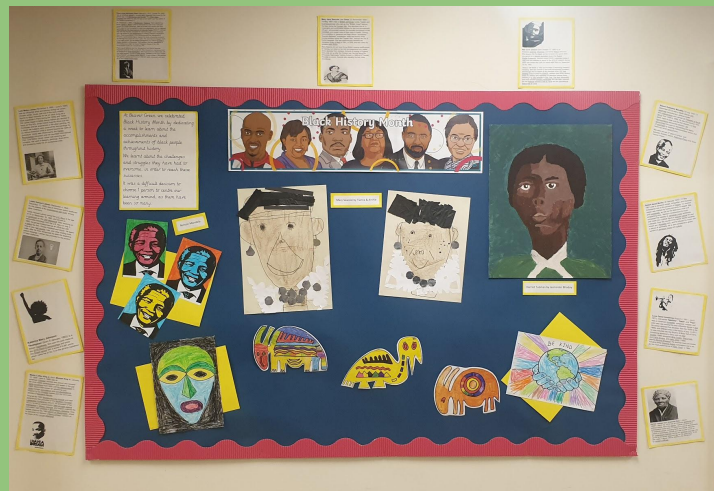
Something that is always at the forefront of our minds is online safety. We are aware that with the new 'lockdown' rules children may be spending more time online.

Please take some time to monitor what your children are accessing on line and check your settings on internet, so that unwanted videos, pictures and other content does not filter through to your children.

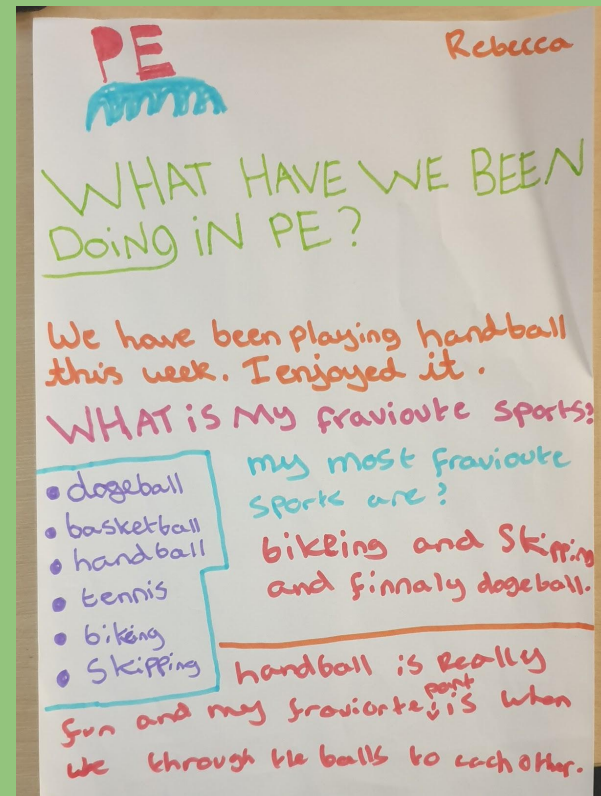
Talk to your child about what to do if they see something that is inappropriate or makes them feel uncomfortable. If you have concerns please don't hesitate to contact us for advice.

In our Maths lessons, we have been learning about money! We have learnt how to recognise the different coins, put them in order and add money!



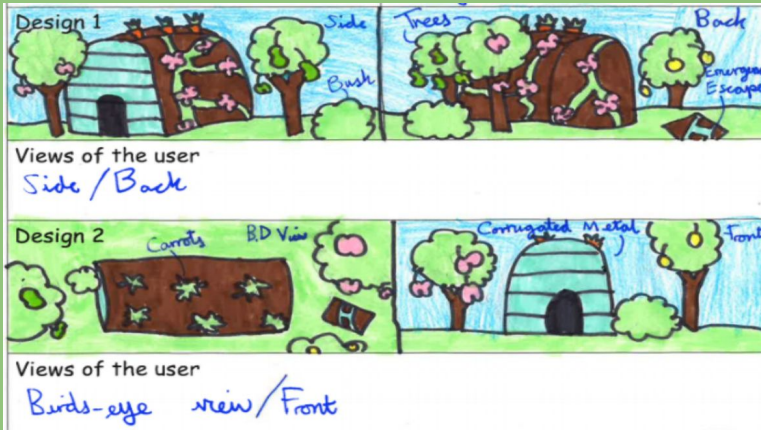
This term in Science, we have been learning about materials! We designed and made boats then tested them to see if they could float!

Last term we revamped our book corner and created a cosy, reading nook. The child love spending time curled up in here, reading a book during our quiet reading sessions.



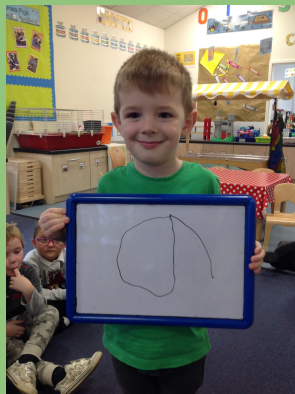
# Learning Heroes

This week Maja is the home learning hero. Maja wrote the sounds we have been learning in class. Well done Maja.



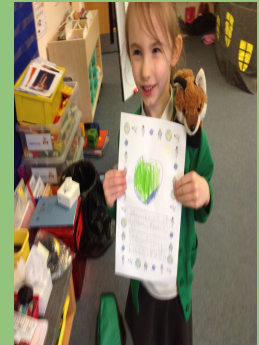


# Learning Heroes

Scarlett is the learning hero of the week in 2OE! She created this fantastic picture to show the London skyline during The Great Fire of London! Well done Scarlett!



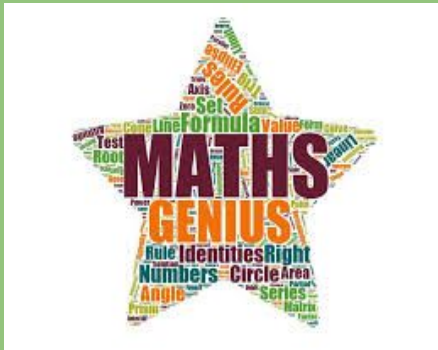
# Learning Heroes

Fantastic learning Ollie!

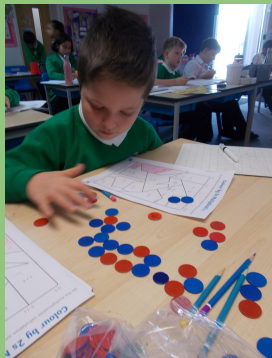
# Learning Heroes

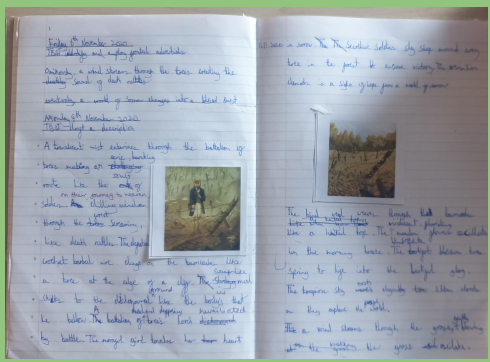
