Nursery



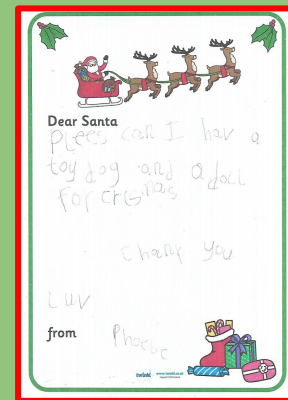
Leo tried really hard to use his "pinchy fingers" to transfer the moon rocks into the container. Super concentrating and persevering Leo. Well done Leo!

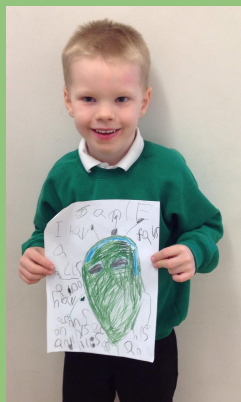
Learning Heroes

Year 1

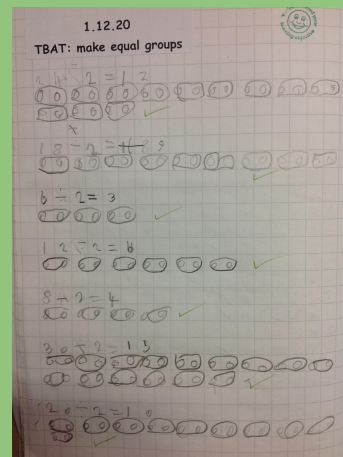


The learning hero this week in 1SJ is Layla, she has been trying really hard with her writing and produced an amazing alien. Well done Layla

Year 2



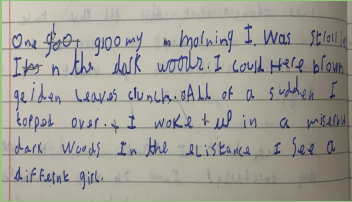
This week's learning hero in 2OE is Tommy for his amazing maths work! Well done Tommy! You are working so hard.

Well done to all of 2NB for their efforts in your music lessons recently. Your beautiful voices have brightened up all the rainy days!

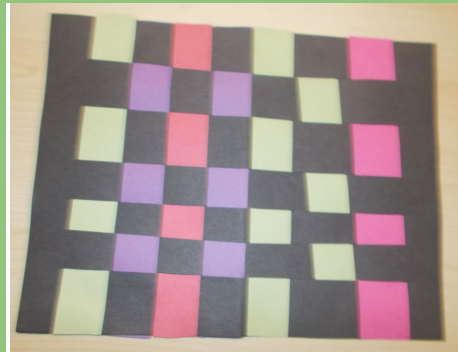
Learning Heroes

Super work, Jordan



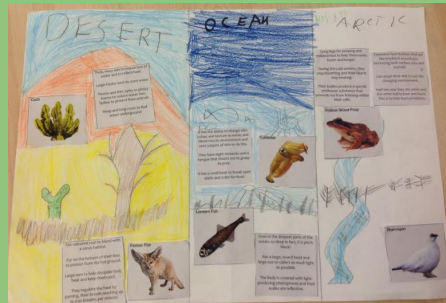

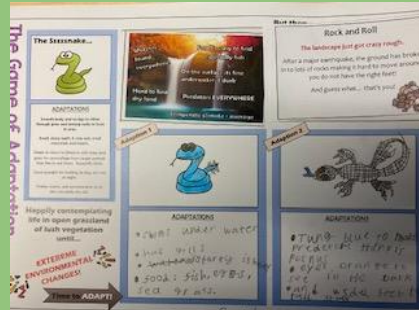
Learning Heroes
