If you have any concerns or questions about getting your child to school on time, please speak to a member of the welfare team.


### **Uniform Expectations**

## Summer Holiday Activities

A family-friendly Dino Trail is heading to Ashford Town Centre this August!

This summer a roar-some Jurassic adventure is heading to Ashford Town Centre with a free, family-friendly Dino trail that allows participants to take a prehistoric walk with dinosaurs, unearth some ferociously fascinating dinosaur facts and be in with a chance of winning some amazing prizes! The interactive trail is brought to you by Ashford Borough Council, in partnership with the LoyalFree app, and is set to launch on the 1st of August and will run over the summer until the 29th of August.



The Dino trail will feature a number of locations across the Town Centre with each location hosting a poster with an educational dinosaur question.

Participants can stomp along the trail and discover the answers by scanning the QR codes on each poster from their smartphones. Explorers who scan a QR code revealing an answer, will automatically be entered into a thrilling prize draw, with an opportunity to win a 'Family Bundle' from Picturehouse Ashford. The bundle includes a family ticket (2x adults, 2x children or 1x adult, 3x children) and four regular soft drinks. One scan equals one entry to the prize draw, so the more locations visited, the more chances you have to win! Participants are warned to keep their eyes peeled for anagram letters along the way, which is found and unscrambled can also be submitted through the LoyalFree app for an additional chance to win.

At the start of term we thoroughly enjoyed a 'Music Day' where we had the opportunity to play lots of different instruments and make our own compositions using these.






In Science we have been learning about Living things and their habitats. We enjoyed classifying and sorting sweets using a classification tree.











