Friday Inspiration

Over the last year, our attention has been drawn to NHS staff who are caring for the ill, and to the scientists who have developed the vaccine for Covid-19. Throughout history there are many people who have made new scientific discoveries, one such person is Rosalind Franklin (1920-1958).



She is best known for her work in understanding the structure of DNA, using x-ray photographs to solve its complexities. Her identification of the double helix has led to huge advances in the field of genetics and modern medicine. Franklin also led pioneering work on the molecular structures of RNA viruses and Polio.

Franklin had a passion for science from an early age and decided to become a scientist at the age of 15. She fought against her father's reluctance to let her undertake higher education and graduated from Cambridge University in 1941. She worked for many years as a first-rate scientist and were it not for her untimely death from cancer in 1958, it is highly likely that she would have shared Nobel Prizes in both 1962 and 1982 for work that she had a huge role in during her lifetime.

Star of the week - Reception










This week **Gracie** and **Leah** are Penguins class' stars of the week. The girls have worked really hard all through




Lockdown. This week they had a go at growing carrot tops and have done some beautiful vegetable printing. Keep up the good work!




'The Enormous Turnip' she carefully drew the characters in this fantastic zigzag book. Amazing illustrations Primrose, well done!







This week, the star for 1SJ is Ganniy for his fantastic letter writing and London Landmark arts and crafts. Well done super work!





4KB's Star of the Week is Noyem.


